Customs formalities for accredited travelers for the Olympic and Paralympic Games of Paris 2024

Purpose

The processing aims to declare, ahead of time and in a digitalized manner, goods:

- Imported in the luggage of accredited individuals participating in the games;
- Re-exported in the luggage of accredited individuals participating in the games.

Legal Basis

The processing is necessary for the fulfillment of a public interest mission or falls within the exercise of public authority vested in the data controller (Article 5, 5° of Law No. 78-17 of January 6, 1978, as amended, known as the Data Protection Act).

The processing is subject to the following provisions:

- Article 250 of the Customs Union Code and Articles 204 and following of Regulation (EU) No. 2015/2446 for temporary admission;
- Articles 60, 81, and 90 to 94 of Regulation (EC) No. 1186/2009 of November 16, 2009, and points 14°, 17°, and 22° of Article 50 octies of Annex IV of the General Tax Code for exemptions.

Retention Period

• The data is kept until July 2025.

Exercise of Rights

Individuals can exercise their rights of access, rectification, erasure, opposition, and limitation with the data controller.
